Class A1 – Instructor’s Class

Open to any instructor of a competing center. Riders will walk and trot. Judge may ask for additional test. Class may be divided into “under 35 years (rider) and over 35 years (rider)” if the number of entries permit. Be ready to show skills and have fun doing so. Special prizes will be awarded.

United Professional Horsemen's Association, Inc. (UPHA) Exceptional Challenge Cup Class

Specifications

- Open to walk and trot riders only
- Rider may not have been judged in a class at a recognized or non-recognized show requiring cantering
- Class is judged on the rail and in a mandatory individual workout at a walk and trot
- Correct diagonals are judged on the rail but not in the individual serpentine workout

Judging in UPHA Exceptional Challenge Cup qualifying classes is based 60% on the rail and 40% on the individual workout. After the riders are judged in both directions on the rail, they line up on one side of the ring. Judges are not permitted to alter the mandatory workout. The announcer reads and repeats the mandatory individual workout twice.

The mandatory workout is:

1. Trot a serpentine to the opposite end of the ring.
2. Return along either rail at an extended walk.

Definitions:

- Serpentine: Series of half-circles performed along an imaginary straight line
- Show trot: The degree of speed, collection, and animation that the horse performs to look its best
- Extended trot: Bold, energetic, balanced, and ground-covering trot with a definite lengthening of stride resulting in an increase of speed without a sense of racing or straining

One handler per entry is permitted in the ring to facilitate rider safety.

2018 CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Divisions: Walk, Minimal Trot/Jog, Advanced Trot/Jog, & Canter/Lope

*Note: Riders may not cross-enter another division or level

EQUITATION CLASSES

Equitation classes are judged on the use of aids, control of horse, and position of the rider. Crops and voice commands are permitted. Riders may compete in either English or Western disciplines unless specified by the class. It is at the judge's discretion what skills are asked in each class.

- **EQUITATION -WALK:** Walk only both directions of the ring. Riders may be asked to individually perform the following: reverse, cones, circle, halt, or serpentine.
Class 4 (leader and side walkers)
Class 5 (one aide)
Class 6 (independent)
- **EQUITATION - MINIMAL TROT/JOG:** Shown both directions of the ring. Riders may be asked to individually perform the following: reverse, circle, halt, serpentine, minimal rising, and/or sitting trot.
Class 1 (leader and side walkers)
Class 2 (one aide)
Class 3 (independent)
- **EQUITATION - ADVANCED TROT/JOG:** Shown both directions of the ring. Riders may be asked to perform the following: reverse, circle, halt, serpentine, rising and/or sitting trot, (describe or perform diagonals), two-point position (describe or perform), rising and/or sitting trot a figure 8, rein back, drop stirrups at walk, extended and/or collected trot.
Class 28 (one aide)
Class 29 (independent)
- **EQUITATION - CANTER/LOPE:** Shown both directions of the ring. Riders may be asked to perform the following: reverse, circle, halt, serpentine, rising and sitting trot (describe or perform correct diagonals), two-point position (describe or perform), rising and/or sitting trot a figure 8, extended and/or collected trot, rein back, drop stirrups at a walk, canter/lope individually or collectively both directions (describe or perform correct leads).

DRESSAGE CLASSES

Dressage rider times are assigned by the show secretary and posted at the entrance gate.

Note:

- ✓ Additional coaching is discouraged and will count against the overall score
- ✓ Horses/ponies may compete more than once.
- ✓ Class is open to western riders

Riders:

- ✓ Will perform test patterns described in this packet
- ✓ Are judged on overall horsemanship, use of aids, accuracy of execution, straightness, and fluidity of ride
- ✓ May have test read exactly as written without penalty

1. Dressage classes (8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 33, 34, 35)
2. Musical Free Style classes (14, 15, 36, 37, 38)

Create your own dressage musical ride!

Riders are encouraged to submit a copy of their ride to the secretary's office the morning of the ride. Music must be in CD format and presented to the announcer the morning of the ride.

Note:

1. The criteria for freestyle judging is enclosed in your packets.
2. Ties will be broken by highest artistic impressions. If points are the same, then there is a tie for the class.
3. Class is open to western riders.

Saturday

Class 14 Walk (aides or independent) – more difficult walk movements are allowed (shoulder-in, half pass). No trotting allowed.

Class 15 Trot/Jog (aides or independent) – more difficult movements are allowed. No cantering allowed.

Sunday

Class 36 Trot/Jog (one aid) – more difficult walk/trot movements are allowed (shoulder-in, half pass). No cantering.

Class 37 Trot/Jog (independent)– more difficult walk/trot movements are allowed (shoulder-in, half pass). No cantering.

Class 38: Canter/Lope Independent – more difficult movements are allowed.

TRAIL CLASSES

- Obstacles are limited to: cones, circle, cavaletti, mailbox, backing, bending, "L," halting within square, transferring object from one point to another, and zigzag.
- Courses are posted Friday evening and throughout the show.
- Courses can be walked/wheeled Friday and Saturday evenings and prior to the start of classes both days.
- Competitors may **NOT** ride their horses over the course prior to competing. However, coaches are permitted to take the horses through the course at the designated times.

COSTUME CLASS

- **Class 7-** Judged on the rider's costume, originality, form, and appropriateness. (Horse and aide(s) may have costumes as well). Riders may be independent if safe and appropriate.

- Riders maneuver through a series of upright poles in this time-based event
- Pattern for classes 42-44 is jog/trot/lope/canter up, walk poles back, walk poles up, jog/trot, lope/canter back at rider discretion

UNITED PROFESSIONAL HORSEMAN'S ASSOCIATION (UPHA) CHALLENGE CUP CLASS

Class 31 UPHA Challenge Class: Judged in accordance with UPHA guidelines. (UPHA test and criteria enclosed)

TRAV CHALLENGE CLASS

Class 32 TRAV Challenge Class

- Judged similar to the UPHA guidelines.
- Only canter riders may participate and will perform a pattern at the canter after being judged both ways of the arena.
- Riders may ride English or Western.

Open only to English or Western riders who have not cantered at any show. Riders perform a pattern at the direction of the judge.

HIGH POINT RIDER

- Awarded to the high point riders in the following divisions: walk, minimal trot/jog, advanced trot/jog, and canter/lope.
- Points are awarded as follows: 1st place - 5 points; 2nd place - 3 points; 3rd place - 2 points, and 4th place - 1 point.
- Points do not count in classes with only one entry.
- Ties are broken by the rider placing highest in the equitation class.
- Points are accumulated in each division and awards presented at the end of the day.

THERAPY HORSE

- Presented to one horse best exhibiting the qualities of a therapeutic riding horse.
- Horses are judged on ground manners as well as mounted; and on soundness, general health and condition; and ability to work well with leaders, side walkers, and students.
- Each center is given two votes to nominate the horse(s) it feels represent the ideal therapy horse.
- All judges provide input, and the winner is announced at the conclusion of Sunday's show.

GUIDE TO SIGNING UP FOR CLASSES

This "cheat sheet" can help to sign up riders for the appropriate classes at each level. **Please remember: Riders are only allowed to compete in one division at one level during the show.**

Walk Only:

Leader and side walkers: Classes 4, 7, 8 or 14, 16, 22

One aide: Classes 5, 7, 9 or 14, 17, 23

Independent: Classes 6, 7, 10 or 14, 18, 24

Minimal Trot:

Leader and side walkers: Classes 1, 7, 11 or 15, 19, 25

One aide: Classes 2, 7, 12 or 15, 20, 26

Independent: Classes 3, 7, 13 or 15, 21, 27

Advanced Trot:

One aide: Classes 28, 33 or 36, 39, 42

Independent: Classes 29, 31, 34 or 37, 40, 43

Canter/Lope:

Independent: Classes 30, 32, 35 or 38, 41, 44

Show Information Summary

- ❑ Class entries are \$10.00/class. There is a \$20.00 late fee for each rider if the entry is postmarked after the deadline. There are no refunds for scratched classes.
- ❑ There are four divisions for riders. Several divisions are split based on the level of assistance required by the rider. It is suggested that riders ride one level below where they ride at home. Riders must be entered in a division and level for all classes.
- ❑ Horse and tack stalls are \$20.00 per night. At least one tack stall is required to keep necessities. No equipment or feed is allowed in the aisle.
- ❑ Arrival time for the horse show begins at noon on Friday prior to the show. If you must arrive before that time, please contact the show manager, Lynda McGarry, at (540) 525-8291, or Ellen Penine at the Virginia Horse Center at (540) 464-2950, two weeks prior to the horse show. Everyone should be at the show and settled in no later than 9 pm on Friday or Saturday evening. If there is a problem arriving prior to the 9 pm curfew, please contact the above mentioned people.
- ❑ The TRAV Horse Show Committee is composed of the show manager(s), show secretary, TRAV board members, judges, ring stewards, and delegated safety monitors. The horse show committee reserves the right to exclude or excuse riders, coaches, volunteers, or horses from the show if they are in violation of these rules.
- ❑ Horses will be well-maintained and cared for. Abuse of animals will not be tolerated.
- ❑ The judge's decision is final. Comments should be taken to the horse show committee.
- ❑ PATH International Standard will be followed for the use of stirrups at this show. Safety stirrups or hard-soled shoes or riding boots are allowed.
- ❑ Proper show tack is required in the show arena. No training equipment is allowed in the show arena. Safety equipment (bell boots, splint boots, Velcro attachments for arms/legs, halters over/under bridles, and side pulls) for horse and rider is allowed:
- ❑ Classes will be split, combined, or canceled at the discretion of the show secretary and manager. Equitation classes with over 10 entries for the walk divisions and over 8 entries for the rest of the divisions will be split.
- ❑ Anyone mounted at any time will wear an ASTM-SEI protective headgear approved for horseback riding. Lightweight helmets must meet the PATH International guidelines and documentation provided to the show secretary.
- ❑ Please follow Virginia Horse Center policy concerning dogs.
- ❑ All riders and volunteers are expected to uphold ring etiquette. Proper spacing is two horse lengths or more. Riders needing tack adjustment must come to the ring center. Do not stop on the rail. Faster horses should stay closer to the rail; slower traffic stay at least 12 feet from the rail. It is the responsibility of the faster rider to avoid the slower rider. During warm-up time, all riders move in the same direction; if another horse is met, pass left shoulder to left shoulder.
- ❑ The mounting ramp and mounting block is located behind barn 5. Please mount and dismount in this designated mounting area.
- ❑ No ribbons or awards are mailed or delivered after the completion of the show on Sunday.
- ❑ The United States Equestrian Federation states the following in its *Drugs and Medication Policies*: "... medication administration practices should never be a substitute for good horsemanship." TRAV does not condone the use of medication to sedate equines in the show arenas.

COACHING GUIDELINES

- If a tack change is necessary, notify the ring steward prior to the “class call.”
- Inform the show secretary of any scratches as soon as possible.
- Know your rider’s schedule. You and your rider are responsible for making the class calls.
- The show committee will stop or hold any class at any time if you notify the ring steward of a safety concern.
- Tack must be well-fitted and conform to each horse and rider's needs. Adaptive tack may be used provided no rider is attached in any way to the horse or saddle in accordance with the PATH International policy. An exception to this policy is materials that will break away easily and involuntarily, such as Velcro and rubber bands.
- Any mounted individual will wear an ASTM-SEI protective headgear approved for horseback riding. Lightweight helmets must meet the PATH, International guidelines and documentation provided to the show secretary.
- Riders are expected to demonstrate as much control and influence of the horse as possible at all required gaits. Leaders and side walkers are only a safety element and should not influence the horse or rider. Judges will penalize riders who rely on volunteers for advice in the arena or whose volunteers guide the horse or help too much.
- Minimum age for volunteers as leaders and side walkers is 14 years.
- Leaders and/or side walkers are not allowed to carry whips in the ring when a class is being judged.
- The trail courses are posted Friday evening and throughout the show. This course can be walked/wheeled by riders on Friday evening and prior to the start of classes both days. Competitors may NOT ride horses over the course, but coaches and volunteers may do so at the designated times.
- Any rider unable to post or unable to sit the trot should be clearly indicated on the entry form. Hearing- or sight-impaired riders may wear armbands during classes for safety purposes. Riders or centers need to provide the armbands.

1. **No smoking in coliseum or barns. This is the law.**

2. **VEHICLES: Drive carefully. OBEY All traffic signs. Speed limits are strictly enforced. Every vehicle operator must have a valid driver's license and proof of insurance. The use of vehicles in the camping areas is restricted to regular roadways for entering and exiting only. Vehicles are permitted only if operated in a safe manner (This is a Virginia state law), but may not be used in the coliseum or in the interior of any of the barns. Four-wheelers and ATV's are not permitted on the VHC grounds. Non-powered scooters, bicycles, skateboards, in-line skates, heelers (skates in shoes) are not permitted in the coliseum or the interior of any of the barns. The VHC reserves the right to prohibit the operation of any vehicle.**

3. **Dogs/Pets: All dogs and pets must have current inoculations for rabies as prescribed by state of residency. No loose dogs/pets are allowed anywhere on the premises. All dogs/pets that are not crated must be on a hand-held or tied leash. Loose dogs and/or pets will incur a \$100 fine. You must clean up after your dog or pet.**

4. **Coliseum: Absolutely no dogs/pets allowed in the coliseum unless they are crated or are service dogs. Absolutely no dogs/pets in the mezzanine (2nd floor of the coliseum) under any circumstances with the exception of service dogs. We ask that your service dog have his/her vest on. Grounds/Parking Areas/Barns/East Complex: All dogs/pets must be on a hand-held or tied leash.**

5. **No trash or sharps in the manure pits or stalls. Sharps should be placed in red boxes in barns and not in trash cans.**

4. **No lunging in posted rings. Wiley, Speed, and B rings NEVER.**

5. **No overnight horses may be stabled in trailers or tied out.**

6. **Horses are absolutely not allowed to be ponied behind any moving vehicles.**

7. **Any loss, theft, accident or disturbance should be reported to the Virginia Horse Center Security. Lost and found is located in the security office.**

8. **No firearms or fireworks are permitted.**

9. **The Virginia Horse Center shall be held harmless against all claims, costs, losses or liability of every nature and kind asserted against or incurred by camper arising or resulting in any respect from camper's occupancy and use of premises, and/or visitor and visitor's use or premises.**
